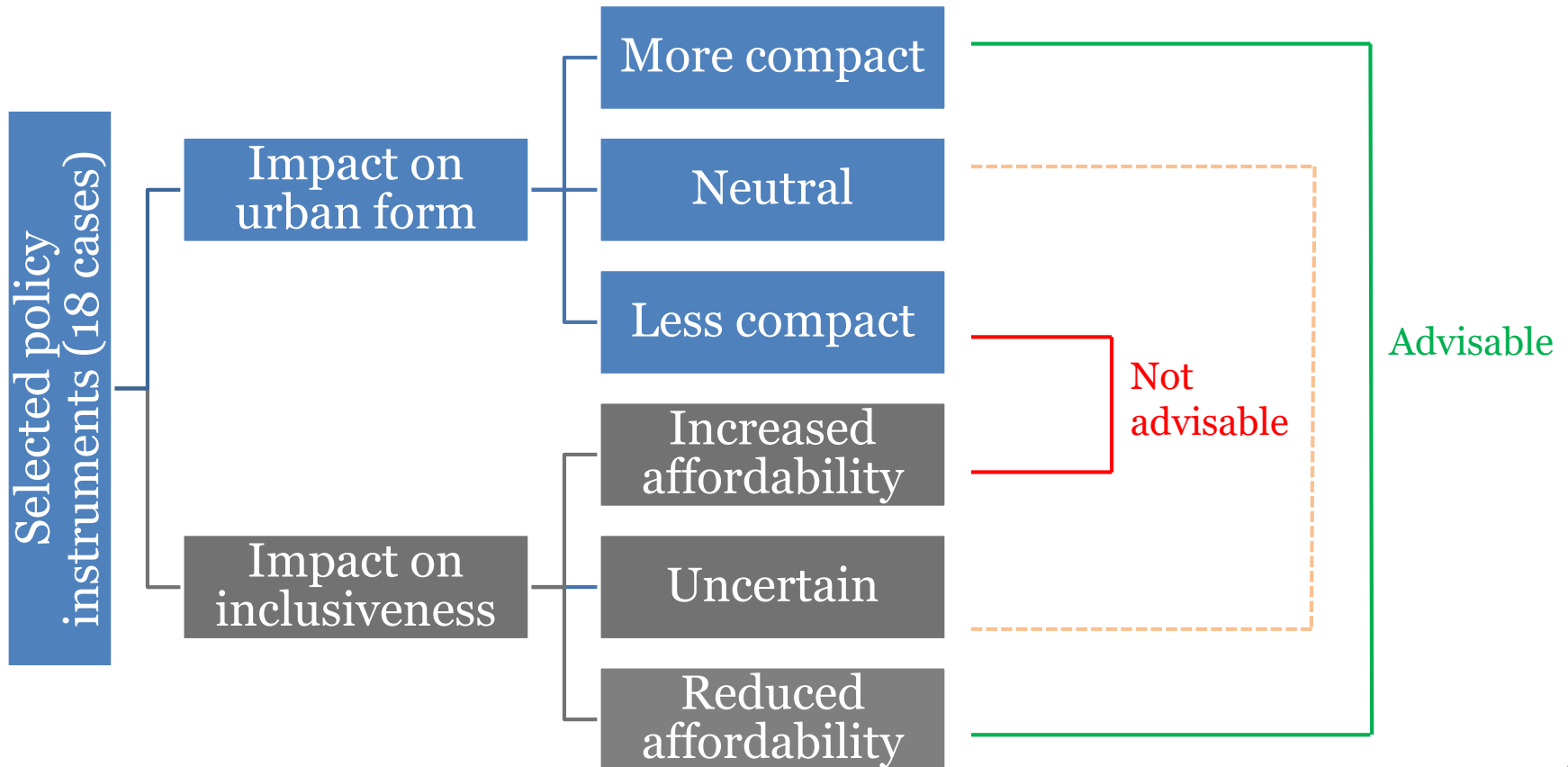
Areas of focus – to support successful NUP implementation

4. Capacity of subnational governments



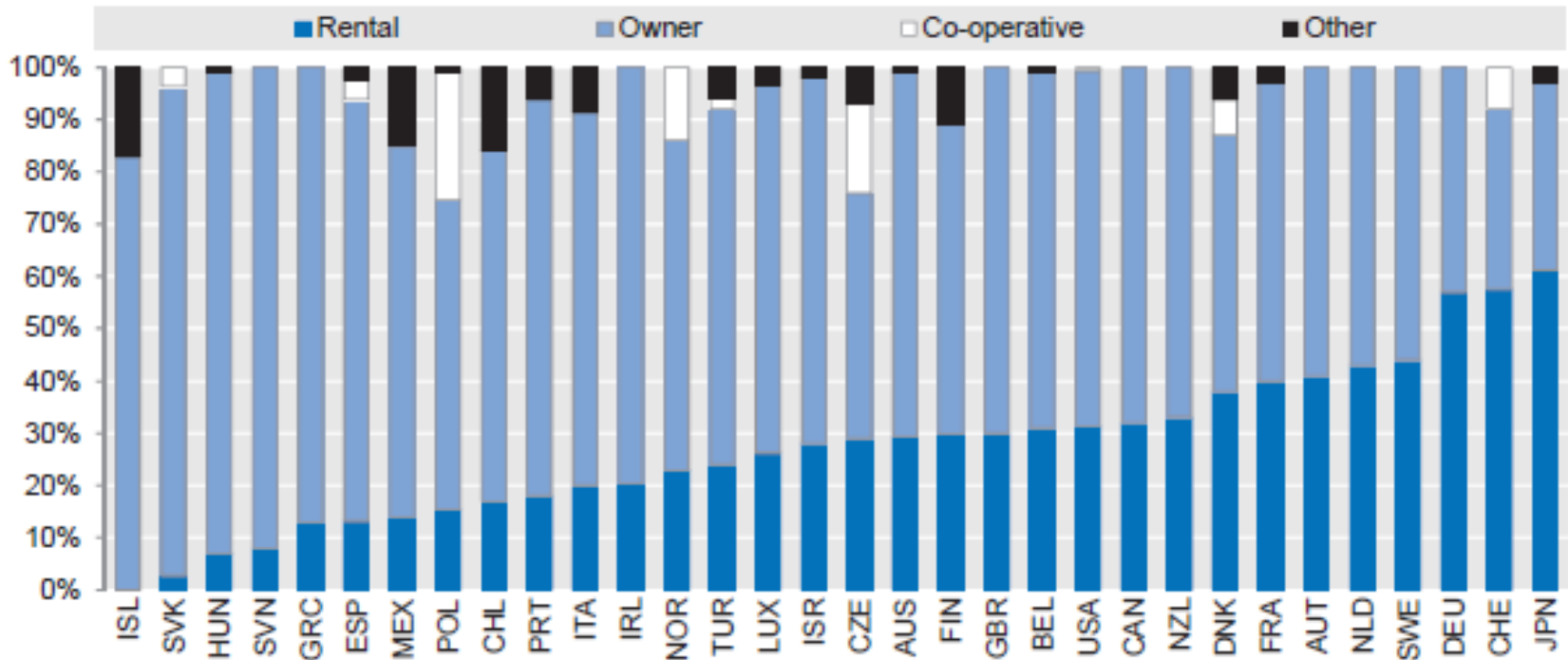
What are the policy tools which have positive impacts both on compactness and inclusiveness?

Percentage of dwelling stock, 2009



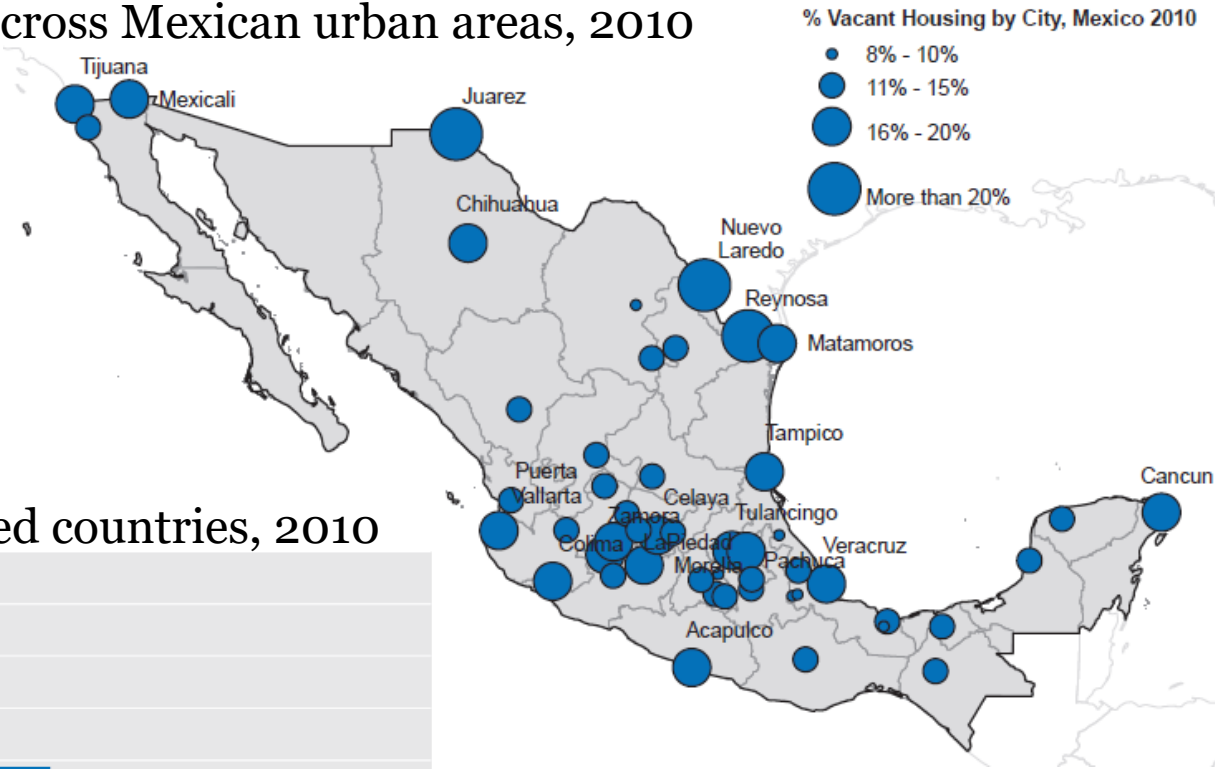

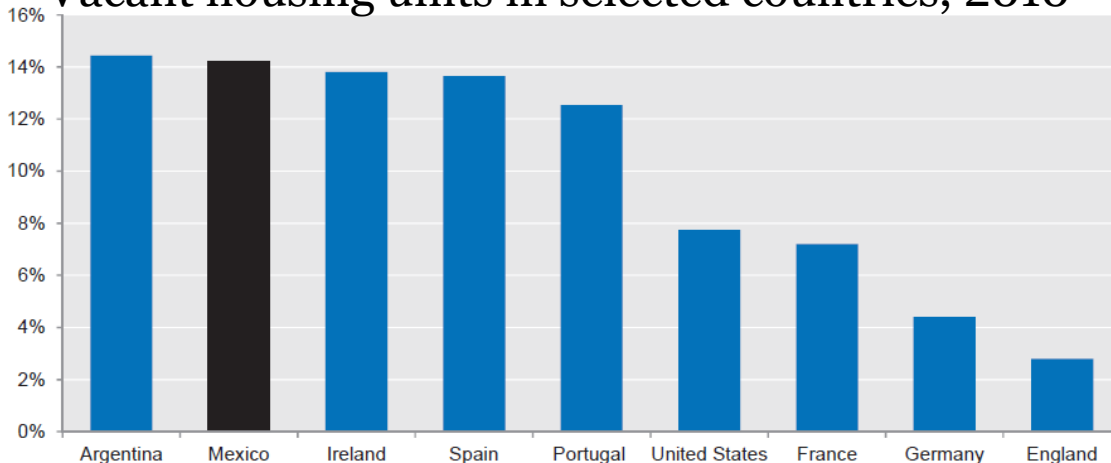


“Space-blind” policies can lead to inefficient housing investment
